



Pine Pathway

What is a pathway?: A pathway is a trail located within the public roadway or right-of-way, which runs parallel to the road. Because of their proximity to roads, pathways serve as alternative transportation facilities and, therefore, are eligible for partial funding from the County's annual gas tax revenue.

ACCESS: From Hwy 67 (Main Street) in Ramona, west on Hwy 78 (10th Street), right on Haverford Road, and left on Pine Street.

LENGTH AND ELEVATION: 1.5 miles one way; 1490' to 1610'.

DESCRIPTION: From the intersection of Haverford Road and Lilac Road, the pathway runs north along both sides of the road for 0.5 mile. Where the road narrows for a culvert, the pathway continues only on the west side of Pine. From the end of this pathway, it is possible to connect with trails in Cleveland National Forest.

RECOMMENDED USES: This pathway is suitable for all categories of nonmotorized recreational and transportation uses.
